jadian Software to be Showcased at Cairo ICT 2008 Forum

Dubai Municipality will demonstrate key modules from its General Inspections & Fines Solution

Lansing, February 23, 2008: jadian enterprises' work with the Dubai Municipality Public Health Department in the United Arab Emirates will be on display at a large regional technology forum in Egypt. Cairo ICT 2008 runs from February 24 - 27 at the Cairo International Conference Center in Nasr City, Cairo. The forum draws over 350 exhibitors from all over the world in the fields of information technology, telecommunications, networking, system integration, banking, and broadcast technology.

In conjunction with local partner Intertec Systems, jadian configured its compliance and inspection software suite to address Dubai Municipality's needs. The configured software was rolled out under the name "General Inspections and Fines System" and provides a management tool for key public health activities such as applications, permits and licenses, complaints, in-field inspections, sample testing, violation tracking, and fees and fine collection. The software is being used by over 200 users across eight business units (Food Inspection, Food Safety, Pest Control, Veterinary Services, Health Control and Epidemiology, Environmental Control, Marine Environments and Sanctuaries, and Public Safety).

In order to support the country's eGovernment initiatives, jadian integrated its software with several key systems, including:

- Dubai Economic Department for licensing and establishment information
- Cash Register Application for payment processing
- FileNet for document management
- Food Import and Re-export System to assess food safety risk of over 80,000 food items
- Lab Information Management System to exchange lab test results on product samples
- Complaints Management System for processing of consumer complaints submitted online
- Oracle Human Resources to track employee-related issues
- eClinic to track health cards for workers

As a result, Dubai Municipality is able to offer its citizens a number of online services as well as manage internal processes in a largely paperless manner. At Cairo ICT, Dubai Municipality will be demonstrating four of these key eServices – Food Control Health Certificates; Clinic Health Certificates; No Objection Certificates for contractors and consultants; and DCL Test Results-Engineering Materials for consultants working on construction projects.
