ANOTHER TECH FIRM MOVES INTO ACD.NET'S LANSING HOME

Another new tenant has moved into ACD.net's new Metro Internet Exchange building in Lansing's Old Town area.

Jadian Enterprises Inc., a software and services company, has moved from a location in Okemos to the 42,000-square-foot MIX building at 1800 W. Grand River.

"Jadian's move into the MIX building marks the beginning of the second phase build-out of mid-Michigan's largest data center," said ACD president and MIX co-founder Kevin Schoen.

Jerry Norris, Jadian president and CEO, said the building offers the advantages of cost-sharing of high-quality network and physical security and telecommunications, as well as technical expertise and business contacts with other tech companies.

Jadian joins several other tech companies in the building, including Citadel Defense Technologies, Computer Data Recovery and IdealSo.

ACD's MIX building includes office space and a technology incubator open to established and start-up enterprises. The MIX building will allow ACD to provide Web hosting and Voice over Internet service to more than 1,000 Michigan companies, and will be ACD's main center for its statewide network.

Equipment for the secure data center service has been constructed in the center of the building and is protected by a concrete bunker.

ACD is a telecommunications and broadband provider, with networks in Grand Rapids, Lansing, Jackson, Ann Arbor, St. Joseph-Benton Harbor, and Saginaw metropolitan areas. ACD provides DSL, fiber, hosting, VoIP, and wireless services.
